## Russia victory day parade 1945

London's New Year's Day Parade (LNYDP) is a major event with global appeal and features more than 8,500 artists representing more than 20 countries. The parade, launched in 1987, has since raised almost £2 million to help a wide range of London-based charities. The parade winds through the city along a two-mile route. You can see marching bands, cheerleaders, dancers, acrobats and more. About half a million spectators line the parade route to watch the entertainment (come rain or shine), and about 300 million TV viewers tune in to watch The London New Year's Day Parade as it is broadcast around the world. All 32 London boroughs are putting a float in front of the parade and each is being assessed by a panel of foreign ambassadors and high commissioners to raise money for local charities. The parade starts at noon on Piccadilly (outside the Ritz Hotel) and ends around 3pm.m. The parade route runs through Piccadilly Circus, Lower Regent Street, Waterloo Place, Pall Mall, Cockspur Street, Trafalgar Square, Whitehall, and ends on Parliament Street. A road map is available on the parade's website. Public transport is the best way to get to the parade route, although you can also take a taxi or drive into town and pay for parking. If you decide to drive, use the car link route planner or Google Maps to plan your route. You reserve a parking space in advance in a parking lot near the parade route on the Q-Park website. London's bus system takes you to different places along the route. Tube stops on and on near the parade route include Westminster, Piccadilly Circus, Charing Cross, Embankment, St. James Park, and Green Park. If you come from out of town, the National Express bus connects to all UK destinations and airports in London. London Embankment Station is 0.2 miles from Trafalgar Square. The bus also stops at London Waterloo Rail Station, which is 0.5 miles from Trafalgar Square. With so many people gathering in London for the parade, here's how to get the best possible view: Pick up a copy of the Parade Post on the day to find out who is performing and when (they are usually available from comment messages or handed out by charity workers). The paper is free, but donations are gratefully received. Aim to get to a vantage point along the route by 11 a.m. to secure a decent spot. LNYDP asked that bands march in silence as they pass the Cenotaph, the war memorial on Whitehall, so if you want to enjoy the music, choose a position away from this area. Celebrity commentators dot the route to introduce the parade performers, so keep your eyes peeled for a famous face. You can watch free along the parade route or book grandstand tickets. We know and believe in it We are invincible when we stand together, Putin said in a televised address after plans for a major military parade on Victory Day in Red Square had to be postponed because of the pandemic. Putin made no mention of the coronavirus in his speech, despite Russia with the fifth highest number of confirmed infections in the world, with nearly 188,000 cases as of Friday. But parts of his speech alluded to the Battle of the Russians against the pandemic. Our veterans fought for life, against death. And we will always be equal to their unity and endurance, Putin said. Huge celebrations were planned for this year's anniversary, with Putin flanked by world leaders as he presided over a procession of military hardware and 15,000 troops parading through Red Square. But when the coronavirus spread around the world and eventually struck Russia, the Kremlin reluctantly accepted last month that the celebrations would not be possible and postponed them to later this year. Instead, Putin laid flowers at the Eternal Flame outside the red brick walls of the Kremlin and gave a solemn speech highlighting the sacrifices of the Soviet Union in what Russians call the Great Patriotic War. A ceremonial guard of honour marched past Putin after his speech, when Russian television showed images of Red Square nearby empty. Neighboring Russia canceled its Victory Day parade over the pandemic and White Russia was the only ex-Soviet country with reported cases to hold the annual event. President Alexander Lukashenko, who is dismissive of the pandemic and psychosis surrounding the virus, watched in military uniform with high brass as about 4,000 troops marched past and planes and helicopters flew overhead. White Russia has recorded more than 20,000 cases of the coronavirus and 121 deaths. The World Health Organization Minsk called for alternative solutions to be found on the anniversary. But the Belarusian strongman, who has been in charge since 1994, said that even the idea of changing the tradition... is inadmissible, and television parade footage showed rows of older veterans watching the parade, many faceless We had no choice but to mark the anniversary, as the eyes of those Soviet soldiers who perished for our freedom look on, Lukashenko said. However, his children and grandchildren were conspicuously absent, while his son Nikolai, reportedly as a potential successor, is at his side. White Russia was one of the first Soviet lands invaded by Germany on 22 June 1941 and occupied until August 1944, although large parts were under the control of his strong Soviet party resistance. The country suffered huge losses, with hundreds of thousands of its Jews also killed in the Holocaust. This year marks the 85th year that the historic event will take its two-mile route, from 77th Street and Central Park West to 34th Street and 7th Avenue, to the delight of more than 30 million people lining the streets and another 50 million enjoying the festivities from the comfort of their own homes. The parade, which originated in 1924 as the Macy's Christmas Parade, began as a promotional stunt to the department store noted. Staff and professional entertainers dressed in costumes and, along with animals from the Central Park Zoo, paraded from 125th Street in Harlem to the Macy's store in Herald Square. The event was so successful that Macy's decided to repeat it annually. At the end of that first parade, Santa Claus made his appearance in Herald Square, officially kicking off the holiday season, a tradition that the parade has since ended. Photo: in a little more parade history?– The first balloon, Felix the Cat, was introduced in 1927 and produced by the Goodwin Tire and Rubber Rubber in Akron, Ohio. Felix was filled with air, but then balloons were filled with helium.- The early balloons, made with address labels sewn into them, were released into the air at the end of the parade. Everyone who found one and emailed it back got a free gift from Macy's.- The parade was suspended during World War II (from 1942-1944) when rubber and helium were relegated to the war effort. It resumed in 1945 and has continued every year since.- The parade was broadcast on local New York radio starting in 1932. It was first covered on TV in 1948.- The classic film Miracle on 34th Street, starring young Natalie Wood, features actual parade footage from 1946 and helped make the parade a permanent part of American culture.- Since 1984, the balloons have been made by Raven Industries of Souix City, South Dakota.- To improve safety, wind measuring equipment has been used to warn parade organizers of unsafe conditions and , during particularly windy conditions, balloons are kept closer to the ground.- If you think the parade is a treat, you watch the balloons being inflated with helium the night before, on 77th and 81st streets between Central Park West and Columbus Avenue.While it's debatable as to whether the best views are curbed or in front of the TV, a view from a seventh floor window on Broadway several years ago gave me a whole new appreciation of it Event.
